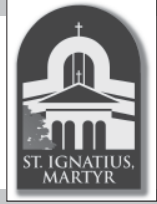

student. By educating 96,197 students in the 2007-2008 school year, Catholic schools in the Chicago area saved the public school system \$1,031,415,280. Nationally, Catholic schools save taxpayers more than \$20 billion.

Prepare for and vote in the Primary Elections

The political parties are holding their primary elections on March 2 with early voting starting on Tuesday Feb 16 and ending on Friday Feb 26. Voting is an important responsibility in carrying out our moral responsibility of being a Faithful Citizen.

As the Bishops have outlined in their Faithful Citizenship Pastoral Letter we need to start with proper formation of our consciences on the issues being or not being addressed concerning public policy. From a faith perspective the goal is to discern which candidate's positions and votes best serve the common good. It is not about serving special interests including our own. If you are not registered to vote that is the first step to take although it is too late for voting in the primaries and working on proper formation of conscience as we prepare to vote.
